SCHEDULE AND COVID IMPACT

Sacred Heart Academy implemented a rotating schedule with longer class meeting times in 2018-2019. Students are required to take five courses, and are limited to six courses per semester.

On March 15, 2020, SHA transitioned to a virtual academic learning platform due to campus closure as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Faculty and students maintained academic rigor and integrity throughout virtual learning until the end of the academic year. During an end-of-year survey, 100% of faculty said they were able to authentically adhere to their curriculum. All courses progressed in both synchronous and asynchronous teaching formats, and we continued to assess students' progress using our traditional grading scale.

GPA/COURSE WEIGHT/RANK POLICY

The school year is divided into two semesters. A cumulative GPA is calculated at the end of every academic year. Final grades calculated in a student's GPA include Sacred Heart Academy and SophieConnect courses exclusively.

AP and Diocesan Scholar Courses are weighted with .5 increase in GPA. Honors Courses are weighted with .25 increase in GPA.

Sacred Heart Academy does not rank. Sacred Heart schools commit to educating the whole child in accordance with the Sacred Heart Goals and Criteria.

SOPHIECONNECT

This unique collaborative program offers demanding online courses to all students of the Sacred Heart Network. Courses are taught by Sacred Heart Network faculty members. Online instruction time is designated within a student's daily class schedule. Eligible students must demonstrate academic maturity and independence to be approved by faculty and administration. Courses for the 2020-2021 school year include General Psychology, Financial Literacy, Intro to Neuroscience, AP Psychology, and AP Music Theory.

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

Sacred Heart Academy students are eligible for induction into the National Honor Society based on GPA and commitment to service. Students are recommended based on the four pillars of NHS: character, scholarship, leadership, and service. In the Class of 2021, 13 of 33 students are members of NHS.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Sacred Heart Academy is committed to encouraging a social awareness which impels to action. Through various service and advocacy events, students complete 25 hours of service annually. Students are encouraged to find meaningful ways to build authentic relationships within the communities they serve.
